The KPMG Professorship on International Corporate Governance is pleased to organize an interactive workshop on corporate governance and geopolitics to take place just before its 6pm round-table exploration of company board challenges in 2022.

This interactive workshop will examine the tools and methods for measuring, adapting to, and communicating about geopolitical risk: what company boards have done in the past; how the context for such board processes is changing; and how the tools and methods ought to change in response to the changing context. The workshop will begin, though, with an exploration of what constitutes geopolitical risk, and how it differs from, and overlaps with, other forms of risk that company boards are expected to assess.

Attendees are welcome to participate actively. Chatham House Rules will apply, meaning that no transcript will be made, and any report of statements made will not be attributed to identifiable persons.

The workshop will be led by **Spyros Maniatis**, Director of the British Institute for International Comparative Law as well as a former Professor of Commercial Law, and **Drew Shagrin**, Professor of Business Law at ESCP.

This workshop will run concurrently with another workshop on corporate governance, human rights, and sustainability.
